## Classroom Updates

<p>Next week we will continue to review all math concepts. I challenged the students to work on a Math test prep in return for no math homework for the rest of the year!</p> <p>Please make sure you check your child's friday folder and see their exit tickets on these daily objectives. Anytime a test goes home please go over mistakes for extra credit.</p>	<p>Students were introduced to our Civil War unit. Students learned about the time period prior to the start of the civil war. Students studied the causes of the civil war by participating a jigsaw activity. Students heard speeches from the Election of 1860. Students decided who they would have voted for in a simulated election.</p>	<p>We began the planning and researching stages of our roller coaster project. The students will design and test their roller coasters made from insulation tubing and using a marble and following a specific criteria of hills and loops. They will test, retest and retest until they have five successful runs.</p> <p>Please ask your child to bring home their notebooks to share what we are learning.</p>	<p>In reading, students read alert to stereotypes and gender norms. Students identified how these factors can affect our perception of a character. Students learned the acronym RUNNERS to use as a testing strategy for the EOG. Students practiced using RUNNERS on a sample test.</p> <p>In writing, students wrote a new draft. Students had to discover a theory about themselves using entries from their journals as well as the provided thought prompts. Students used the memoir checklist/rubric to evaluate their writing and guide further writing.</p>
